


































































































National Jaguar Rally Christchurch Easter 2024.

Winters settling in down here with beautifully clear but cool days and even cooler nights. Don't worry. This won't be an issue next March for our rally.

We are delighted by the number of registrations to date but be assured there is room for more. Our venues are not number restricted so literally 'the more the merrier'.

There have been questions around the availability of concessions on the inter-island ferries. Sorry but to date we have not been successful in getting either ferry company to address this matter. They are focussed on the current shortage of ships, disruptions to their timetables due to mechanical breakdown, weather delays and a pressing demand from the public and business sectors for space. Giving concessions appears to be off the cards at this point but we will continue to meet with them. Our advice however is that given the issues mentioned above you should reserve / confirm your space on the ferries now rather than hold off in the hope of perhaps getting a discount.

One objective of our rally is to attract a greater numbers of entries in the concours competition. Concours is a great tradition of car shows and rallies all around the world. An opportunity for owners of vehicles on which they place considerable time and effort (and money in many cases) in ensuring that the vehicles are presented well.

Perhaps one of the draw-backs in the past has been a lack of understanding exactly what concours is about and exactly how it is going to be judged. So here is that information:

Understanding Concours - National Rally 2024.

With these few words we hope we can encourage you to enter your car into our National Rally Concours Event. We are about, but not limited to, ensuring our older models are preserved.

Your car might be 10 years old or older, it doesn't matter. If your car is well cared for, clean and in good condition you could be a winner.

- Cars are inspected for condition, cleanliness and originality, and fully restored cars are very welcome.
- Clean your car inside and out. This makes the judge's job easier to assess the real car rather than
 one covered in dirt or full of travel clutter.
- A points system considering the cars age will apply, so as not to give the later models an advantage.
- This is not a Pebble Beach type of competition.
- Enter and enjoy the experience with a great bunch of likeminded enthusiasts.

Some basic requirements for the 2024 Concours.

- Only cars registered up to and including 2014 will be accepted to enter the concours competition.
- · Cars need to be thoroughly washed and cleaned, before being presented for judging.
- Cars are to be parked in the event area, owners to open: the bonnet, doors, boot lid and soft tops down as required.
- Judging Team 1 will inspect, then the owners will be asked to close those opened items.
 - Judging Team 2 will then complete their inspection of remaining areas.
